- 3. Commit to volunteering each week at Credo Academy, up to 60 hours per semester.
- 4. Agree not to participate in academic programs funded by the public-school system while you are enrolled at Credo Academy. (This excludes dual enrollment for college classes).
- 5. Agree to abide by the Code of Conduct.
- 6. Agree to abide by the Credo Dress Code.
- 7. Agree to abide by the Conflict Resolution Policy.
- 8. Sign the Credo Photographic Release.
- 9. Agree to the Credo Academy Registration & Payment Agreement (found on separate document).
- 10. Agree to terms and conditions (found on separate document or on the website).

CODE OF CONDUCT

It is by his deeds that a one distinguishes himself, if his conduct is pure and right. Proverbs 20:11

The Credo Academy Code of Conduct promotes a Christ-like attitude in its learning environment and encourages the development of positive Christian relationships among its students. Therefore, it sets specific guidelines for student behavior. Although parents are primarily responsible for dealing with discipline, if needed, Credo may employ mild forms of reproof, rebuke, and correction. Credo Academy reserves the right to suspend or expel students with serious discipline problems at any time during the year.

- 1. Students must show respect to adults at all times. If redirected, students should be quick to change course and follow the direction
- 2. Students should treat each other with respect, kindness, and compassion, as God commands in Matthew 7:12, "So in everything do to others what you would have them do to you."
- 3. Students must also wear name tags while onsite. Students must be prepared for class by being punctual, completing assignments, and bringing necessary supplies. Parents must make certain that students arrive on time for their class(es) and may not allow their students to remain all day on campus if they are not taking classes. Dishonesty, cheating, copying another's work, or deliberate deception, is not permitted.
- 4. The facility and grounds must be kept clean and orderly, in order to show an attitude of gratefulness and respect. No horseplay, running, or rough play is allowed during or between classes. Students must remain in the basement of ARBC at all times and on the north side of the building during Credo hours.

- 5. Public displays of affection such as hand holding, kissing, activities that excludes others, etc. are not permitted. Students may not be in a classroom that does not have adult supervision.
 - 6. Electronic devices, such as mobile phones or laptops, may only be used for academic purposes. Students may only text or make phone calls at the front desk. Playing games, browsing the Internet, texting or use of social media is not permitted while onsite. Electronics may be taken away from the student and placed at the front desk until the end of the day if used inappropriately. Please label all personal items.
- 7. No tobacco products, vaping, illicit drugs, alcohol, weapons, knives, or inappropriate printed material are allowed on site or at a Credo Academy function. Profanity is not allowed.
- 8. Student's appearance should reinforce and reflect a healthy educational environment and be appropriate for learning. Student attire should hold to high standards of modesty and neatness. Credo Academy reserves the right to send home any student who is deemed to be inappropriately dressed.
